

#### Building Maintenance Updates this Quarter:

FROM THE OFFICE OF THE MAYOR OF NYC:

All residential buildings, schools, institutions, and agencies must recycle with the Department of Sanitation in clearly labeled bins or clear bags. The building will place new bins on each service landing, one blue, one green, with instructions for use. Please make sure that all bottles, cans and plastic containers are thoroughly rinsed before placing in the follow receptacles.

Recyclable items include glass, metal, rigid plastic, and beverage cartons (blue decal); and paper and cardboard (green decal).

**BICYCLE STORAGE:** 

It has come to our attention that several bicycles in the storage shed are not hung in proper slots. Bicycles have been observed chained to the wall and in front of those properly hung on pegs.

All bicycles MUST be tagged with the apartment number of the tenant. Please note that carriages, strollers and other items are not permitted. They prevent others from accessing bicycles and will be removed.

If you do have a bicycle you are no longer using, you may want to donate it to a charitable organization such as Recycle-A-Bicycle. As a reminder, there is a \$100 fee per year (per bicycle) for renting a space.

HOUSEKEEPING UPDATE:

Housekeeping:

Please be advised that effective July 1, 2017, charges for housekeeping services will be as follows:

Daily Cleaning:

\$31.25 per ½ hour plus tax
\$62.50 per hour plus tax

General Cleaning: \$59.00 per person per hour plus tax

Self Service: \$3.00 per wash \$3.00 per dry

Wash and Fold: \$7.50 per wash \$7.50 per dry/fold

These increases are necessary to defray the annual wage increase stipulated by the union and rising.

#### Famous Past Residents



Did you know that John Wayne was once a guest of the Hampshire House? In this photo, he is with William Holden in New York City 1960, likely promoting The Horse Soldiers, a war film fraught with production troubles including the devastating death of one their stuntman during the filming of the final scene. But, he later won an Oscar for Best Picture for The Alamo in 1960, and Best Actor in True Grit in '69.

Born Marion Mitchell Morrison in 1907, he started his career at local film studios after a surfing accident prevented him from a football career with USC. He went on to star in a total of 83 westerns – ironic since he was rejected by the US Navy himself due to physical ailments. But that's not the only irony of John Wayne's life. An early-professed Democrat, he later became very conservative, announcing in an interview with Playboy in 1971 he advocated white supremacy.

Sadly, an experimental cancer vaccine didn't work and he passed in 1979, at the age of 72.




### Hampshire House Website Gets an Update Too!
